Biography

He received his B.E. in Civil Engineering from the Lebanese-American University (LAU) in 2002 and his M.S. in Civil Engineering from MIT in 2004. His thesis topic was the use of sensors in civil structures for structural health monitoring purposes. Daher joined one of the largest construction companies in the Middle East in the Automation Department on the Dubai Mall Project in the U.A.E. In 2008, he received his MBA in Finance from Boston University. He later joined a Lebanese-Brazilian software and internet company for two years. In 2011, he started teaching as a part-time faculty member in two leading Lebanese schools of architecture. In 2014, Daher became a full-time faculty member at the Faculty of Architecture, Arts and Design (FAAD), Notre Dame University-Louaize (NDU).
