

His book tells of the Arab immigration into Cuba at the beginning of the sixteenth century. It details the influence of Arab culture on Cuban society and recounts the ways the Arab community in Cuba developed at the beginning of the twentieth century.


In his opening speech, the author explained that the book focuses on the family and social structure of Arab immigrants. He also said that the book explains the reasons behind the success of the Arabs and the important positions they attained be it in the fields of business, politics, and culture.

The book also lists the names of 1800 Arab families living in Cuba, the majority being of Lebanese origin. The integration of Arabs in Cuban society was another significant point he mentioned.

Mr. Paredes went on to thank the former Cuban Ambassador to Beirut, H.E. Dario de Urra Torriente and his wife H. E. Maria Isabelle Velasquez, the former Director of Cultural Affairs at the Cuban Embassy; the current Cuban Ambassador to Beirut, H.E. Mr. Jose Manuel Serrano; Mrs. Wafiqa Ibrahim, the translator at the Cuban Embassy in Beirut, who oversaw the translation of the book from Spanish into Arabic, and high level officials from the Cuban Embassy in Beirut.
