Through *Les Amis de Portugal-Liban*, Lebanese-French artist Mr. Sami Hamaoui, gave one of his paintings to the Lebanese Emigrant Nucleus Museum at Notre Dame University-Louaize (NDU). In 2012, Mr. Hamaoui took a three-month live-model design course at the Ecole Nationale Supérieure des Beaux Arts of Paris. He mainly paints with oil, aquarelle, and mixed techniques. He has had several painting exhibitions, some of which include Université Saint-Joseph (USJ), Beirut in 2012; Ninar Art Café BabSharki, Damascus, in 2011; Espace l'Harmattan Paris, in 2010; Malta International Biennale in 2008, and Ecole de Management de Lyon in 2000.

Mr. Hamaoui is also a photographer. His preferred themes are portraits, nature, and cities. In 2010, he presented a photography exhibition at Espace Brémontier, Paris.
