In 1892, four brothers Joao (Hannah), the great-grandfather of Mr. Enne, Mr. Ibrahim el- Hani and his wife, Thereze Abi-Chabke, left Lebanon with their children Jorge, Rachid, and Amin Ibrahim Hani from Zouk Mikael and went straight to Brazil. Their primary place of residence was Santa Maria Madalena in Rio de Janeiro. They later moved to different regions across the country as they married.

Mr. Enne's will to find out more about his family roots is a lifelong journey, he said.
